INTRODUCTION

One of the images that the New Testament uses for the Church is that of a bride in anticipation of her wedding day. The subtitle of this entire series is rooted in that concept. Consistent with that imagery, the Church as the bride of Christ has much to do in preparation for that day. In this session, we will focus on two of those things. The first is carrying out the mission that Christ gave the Church before

His ascension, to make disciples of people from all nations. We call this the Great Commission. It is the primary vocation given to the Church to carry out as we

wait for Christ's return.

The second, like for any bride, is preparing herself for the bridegroom. Paul had great concern that the Churches he wrote to should be prepared to be presented to Christ on that day. Holiness and

obedience have corporate community aspects not just individual ones. This is not how we are used to thinking, but we will strive to continue to make progress in thinking of ourselves as a people and not just a collection of individuals. As you work through this session, keep in mind that though there are individual ramifications for us, the command of the Great Commission and the exhortations given to the Church as the Bride are given to us corporately as the people of God and not just as individuals.

PRE-CLASS PREPARATION

- 1) Read "World Mission", Chapter 6 from *Total Church* by Tim Chester and Steve Timmis found in the Small Group Readings guide that accompanies this study.
- 2) A large portion of the New Testament is made up of letters written to Churches by the Apostle Paul or, in the case of Revelation chapters 2 and 3, the Lord Jesus himself. Most of these letters contain both words of affirmation and commendation as well as admonishment and condemnation. You might look over the examples from Revelation chapters 2 and 3 to notice this pattern.
 - If the Apostle Paul was to write a letter to TBC in our context in modern America, can you think of a couple of things he might affirm in us and a couple of things he might admonish us about?
 - How do you think our modern congregations would respond to the authority Paul often exerted in his letters?

- 1) Watch the Session 5 video clips "Missions Exists Because Worship Doesn't" by John Piper, and "State of the World" and "What is UPG?" by Global Frontier Missions.
- 2) Read Matthew 28:18-20.
 - What exactly is Christ commanding them to do in this passage? What is a disciple?
 - How does the Church carry out this command?
